**Celebration® Maple**

*Acer x freemanii* 'Celzam'

A hybrid of the Silver and Red Maples, the Celebration Maple is a deciduous accent tree that gets energetic growth from the Silver Maple side of its family. The excellent grower elevates at a stellar rate of 3 to 7 feet per year. Bright yellow-orange and red-orange hues in Fall.

## Autumn Blaze® Maple

A slow growing, medium-sized tree with a broad rounded crown. It makes a fantastic compact shade tree, with smooth gray (almost beech-like) bark and bright green leaves that turn yellow-orange-gold in fall. Yellowwood is also prized for its early summer display of white, wisteria-like flower panicles that are borne heavily in alternating years or every third year. The tree gets its name from the bright yellow color of freshly cut heartwood.

Young trees grow in an upright fashion and in somewhat of a conical shape. They are vase-shaped in their youth. As a Kousa matures, it develops more horizontal branching, rounded form, and becomes more wide-spreading.

An excellent habitat and food source for wildlife.

Oval leaves (to 3" long) emerge purple when young, turn bronze green with red veining during the growing season and finally turn varying orange fall color. Crimson buds open in spring to deep pink flowers (1.5" diameter). Flowers are followed by bright red crabapples (to 3/8" diameter) that mature in fall and may persist into winter. Birds are attracted to the fruit. Fruit may be harvested for jellies.

**Sugar Tyme® Crabapple**

Glossy green leaves have five lobes, turning maroon and persisting well into fall. An overall course texture, even the young branches are covered bark with corky fissures.

**Tulip Poplar**

A deciduous tree that may grow 90 to 120 feet tall and takes its name from its greenish-yellow heartwood and attractive tulip-like flowers. The bark is smooth and dark green on young trees. As the tree ages, wide, white furrows that separate flat ridges develop. In late spring, 2.5-inch flowers with yellow-green petals and an orange corolla mature. It can have superb fall color of yellow to golden yellow but leaves fall prematurely. State Tree of Tennessee.

A hybrid between the American Sycamore and Oriental Sycamore. It has superior resistance to Anthracnose and Frost Cracking compared to the pure American Sycamore. Its exfoliating bark begins with shades of green to tan to brown, which peel away to reveal a cream-white colored bark with age.

**Heritage® Oak**

*Quercus x macdanielii* 'Clemons'

The Heritage oak develops into an oval shape. It has a strong central trunk that features wide lower branches. Those branches taper towards the crown of the tree. Deep green, lobed leaves turn into yellow and brown shades before dropping for the season.

Kindred Spirit is a fast growing oak with glossy leaves that turn a stunning red-orange in the fall. This outstanding columnar oak gets its slim figure from crossing an Upright English Oak with a Swamp White Oak. It's tight, upright habit makes it perfect for small, urban spaces. Highly resistant to powdery mildew and urban pollution.

Northern Red Oak

*Quercus rubra*

A medium-sized, moderate to fast-growing, deciduous tree with a rounded to broad spreading crown that branches close to the ground. They have 7 to 11 pointed lobes that are sharply pointed at the tips. The fall foliage is reddish-brown. The bark is smooth on young trees but as it ages, wide, flat-topped ridges and shallow furrows develop. The shallow furrows form a pattern resembling ski tracks. First bears fruits at 20-25 years but doesn't produce acorns in abundance until 40-50 years.

Pin Oak

*Quercus palustris*

One of the faster-growing red oaks. It has a more slender graceful appearance than some oaks. Adaptable to drier and urban conditions. The crown is pyramidal to oval. Won't begin producing acorns until around 20 years old. The branching pattern is unique with the lowermost branches being angled sharply downward, the middle branches horizontal, and the upper branches ascending. Young trees and lower branches of older trees hold leaves throughout winter.

Sawtooth Oak

*Quercus acutissima*

Sawtooth Oak is a medium-sized tree. It grows up to 75 feet tall and is broad pyramidal becoming oval. It can produce acorns as young as 10 years of age and acorns are produced profusely on mature trees. Fall foliage is yellow/brownish in the south and tardily deciduous. It is fast growing as a young tree and heat tolerant.

**Willow Oak**

**Bald Cypress**

The bald cypress is a long-lived, pyramidal, deciduous conifer, and a cone-bearing tree. Old trees develop a wide, spreading base that narrows up the trunk with diameters as thick as 3 to 6 feet. A younger tree typically has a pyramidal habit; older specimens have an irregular flat top. It is native to southern swamps, however, it grows very well in drier, upland soils.

It is excellent in a woodland garden or as part of a foundation planting.

It resists most diseases, insects, periodic droughts, and deer. This tree can grow 3 to 4 feet per year in optimal conditions.

**Norway Spruce**

It is noted for its rapid growth. Primary branches are slightly upturned but secondary branches become pendulous as the tree matures.
